SBIRT Pre-Screening Tools

- These are quick questions leading to further screening if positive.
- Alcohol Use Disorders Identification Test -- Consumption (<u>AUDIT-C</u>)
- National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) single screening question (page 8, NIAAA Clinician's Guide)

Commonly-Used Screening Tools With SBIRT

- Alcohol Use Disorders Identification Test (AUDIT) (page 15, NIAAA Clinician's Guide)
- Drug Abuse Screening Test (<u>DAST</u>)
- Alcohol, Smoking, Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST)
- Cut-down, Annoyed, Guilty, Eye-Opener (<u>CAGE</u>)
 - The <u>USPSTF discounted CAGE</u> because it detects only alcohol dependence and not the full spectrum of unhealthy alcohol use
