1 2 3 4	<b>Whereas:</b> Whereas the COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically increased the demand for telehealth services, allowing patients to receive necessary medical care without risking exposure to the virus, and
5	Whereas: Medicare's coverage and payment policies for telehealth have served as a vital lifeline
6 7	for many patients, particularly those in underserved areas, who would otherwise have limited access to healthcare services, and
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9 10 11	Whereas: the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (CAA) extended several telehealth flexibilities for Medicare patients through December 31, 2024, including a waiver for originating site requirements, allowing patients to receive services via telehealth from home and other
12 13	locations, rather than just clinical settings, and
14 15 16	<b>Whereas:</b> the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) policies will end on May 11, 2023, and
17 18 19	<b>Whereas:</b> the CAA extended coverage for audio-only telehealth visits for Medicare patients through December 31, 2024, and
20 21 22	<b>Whereas:</b> coverage and payment policies and telehealth will see significant unwinding of temporary flexibilities, and
23 24 25	Whereas: it is essential for the medical community to advocate for policies that ensure accessibility and affordable healthcare for all patients, now therefore be it
26 27 28	<b>RESOVED:</b> that NJAFP petition the NJ State Legislature to require that NJ commercial insurance companies continue to cover telehealth in accordance with the coverage and payment policies set forth by the CAA for Medicare.
