

## NJAFP 2024 Resolution #8 Proposed by Kelly Ussery-Kronhaus, MD, FAAFP

## Resolution Urging Action Against Formulary Restrictions and Mandatory Specialist Referral by Insurance Companies

Whereas: the New Jersey Academy of Family Physicians (NJAFP) is committed to promoting
the highest standards of healthcare and advocating for the well-being of patients under the banner
of family medicine; and

Whereas: primary care phys

Whereas: primary care physicians play a crucial role in the delivery of comprehensive and continuous care, ensuring the overall health and well-being of their patients; and

Whereas: the NJAFP has observed a growing trend of insurance companies imposing restrictive formularies that impede the ability of primary care physicians to prescribe necessary medications for their patients, limiting the scope of effective primary care; and

**Whereas:** some insurance companies mandate patients to seek specialist consultations for conditions that traditionally fall within the purview of primary care, disrupting the patient-physician relationship and leading to unnecessary healthcare expenditures; and

Whereas: the interference of insurance companies in the decision-making process of primary care physicians poses a threat to the principles of patient-centered care, potentially compromising patient outcomes; and

**Whereas:** transparency in formulary development and specialist referral criteria is essential for maintaining the integrity of the patient-physician relationship and ensuring optimal patient care, now therefore be it

**RESOLVED:** the New Jersey Academy of Family Physicians (NJAFP) request through resolution to the AAFP COD and/or board requests that the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) advocate for increased transparency from insurance companies regarding their formularies and the criteria used for specialist referrals, and be it further

**RESOLVED:** that the NJAFP advocate for legislation and/or regulation at the state and national levels promoting legislative measures at both state and national levels to protect the autonomy of primary care physicians in prescribing medications and managing patient care, preventing undue interference by insurance companies, and be it further

**RESOLVED:** that the NJAFP collaborate with relevant stakeholders to develop evidence-based guidelines for formulary development, ensuring a comprehensive and patient-centered approach to primary care, and to support research initiatives that investigate the impact of formulary

- restrictions and specialist referral mandates on patient outcomes, healthcare costs, and the overall quality of primary care services, and be it further
