

Dr. Rachel Rosenberg is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Family Medicine at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School and an attending physician at University Hospital in Newark. She also serves as Medical Director of the New Jersey Family Practice Center and Course Director for Patient-Centered Medicine and Health Equity within the pre-clerkship curriculum.
